FIND OUT IF YOU NEED PLANNING PERMISSION

A new online self-service planning tool has been launched that enables any one in Buckinghamshire to check if an idea they have for a project is likely

to be allowed under national permitted development rights or whether it may require planning permission. The service is part of a national pilot by the Department for Levelling Up, Communities and Housing (DLUCH) to improve submitting and processing planning applications.

The new service works by doing a high-level check of the project against legislation and Geographic Information System (GIS) data to see if the project may fall under 'permitted development'. The service also warns if other types of consent, such as prior approval, tree consent or listed building consent may additionally be required.

This new service is available to use now on Buckinghamshire Council's website: https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/planning-and-building-control/check-if-you-need-planning-permission/

There is also an option to use a new online application service to allow homeowners and planning professionals to apply for a lawful development certificate as an alternative to using existing planning application submission tools.

Both services ask applicants questions specific to their project, meaning that users don't need to be planning experts to start researching the changes they can make to their homes.

The self-service planning tool is free to use and can be accessed on the Bucks Council website

In addition to these two self-serve public-facing tools, the planning team at Buckinghamshire Council is also testing a new back-office system to make the lawful development assessment process more efficient and transparent for both applicants and planning officers.

If you have a problem with a footpath/pavement, you need to register the problem with Buckinghamshire Council Fix-my-Street reporting system — 01296 382416 or www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk If your problem is with a Public Footpath crossing a farmers or other landowner land or a Bridleway then please contact Buckinghamshire Council Rights of Way Team.



This includes: broken stiles, overgrown vegetation or fallen trees, damaged or dangerous path surfaces, damaged or dangerous bridges, damaged or missing signposts and waymarks. Landowners are required to keep rights of way open and useable; this includes providing and maintaining stiles

GRAND FIREWORK DISPLAY – 5TH NOVEMBER

This years event, the first for several years following widespread requests throughout the parish to 'Bring Back Guy'! took place 5th November on the Parish Field sharing the event with Dinton Cricket Club who, with the outstanding assistance of Steph, landlady par excellence of The Seven Stars (you know we all love you), provided all the facilities for catering, children's fun, music and much merriment and bonhomie as approx. 250 people gathered to enjoy the display.

They also trained a few 'locals' on the night who are now being put through an approved training course such that we will always have the required expertise for future events.

WE NEED YOUR HELP!

Dear Residents of Dinton, Ford and Upton, we need your help. As many of you may be aware the track from Westlington Lane to the Lower Road has been recently blocked by several locked gates (Jan/Feb 2022) installed by one of the landowners.

This path has been used for decades by locals as a Footpath, Bridleway, and even on occasion (when the road out of Westlington had been blocked) as a Byway. Therefore, we are working on collecting user evidence statements for a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO) to add the route as a Bridleway to the Definitive Map along the below route. Officially adding this route to the Definitive Map would provide valuable off-road access for walkers, cyclists and horse riders and would be a great asset to the community.

CUDDINGTON & DINTON SCHOOL NEWS

It seems a while ago since we welcomed all the new children into the school they have all settled in so well and the other children have made them very welcome.

We are most certainly back into the rhythm of school as it should be, we constantly strive to improve and are excited to have introduced a new writing model into the school that we piloted last term and is now being used consistently through the school. We welcomed all parents into school for the 'Meet the Teacher' sessions and also for an introduction to the new writing program which has been very well received.

The children were very interested in the period of mourning for the Queen. In Collective Worship on both sites, we spoke to the children about the death of the Queen. We discussed her role as a monarch and her dedication and service to the people of Great Britain and the Commonwealth. Part of the conversation was about her role as a mother, Grandmother and Great Grandmother and obviously about having tea with Paddington Bear! The children were very thoughtful and understood the idea of the period of mourning. We lit a candle and shared a prayer.

Despite a very blustery start to the second half of the Autumn term we have already had lots of visitors to the school. Staff came from Quainton School to look at how we organised our teaching and curriculum. Our staff and children made them very welcome. We also had four Oxford Brookes students start their two-week phonics placement at the Infant site as well as a trainee teacher in year 6 who will be staying with us until 12th December.

We had a visit from Helen Smith, Early Years adviser from Bucks, who was delighted with the changes to the Foundation classroom and outside area. She noted the changes had made a significant difference to the learning environment and the children were thriving.

Earth Day was celebrated by staff and children with a selection of learning activities: finding out about sea turtles, creating seascapes, effects of overfishing and coral reefs. The year 1&2 children had a fantastic time at Quainton Railway Museum.

More recently the collective worship theme has been on Remembrance and the children have shown great respect for the subject. The culmination of this was the services at the war memorials in Cuddington and Dinton Churches. We were very happy to welcome Mr Caudren and Mr Clifton in their uniforms, to both occasions. It was also lovely to see so many parents, grandparents and other family members joining us. As ever, the children were superbly behaved.

We are now looking forward to the festive season with all the joy and magic it brings to the children!

The raffle will be drawn after the Carol Service on 11th December.


There will be a celebration of Holy Communion on Christmas Day at 10am.
