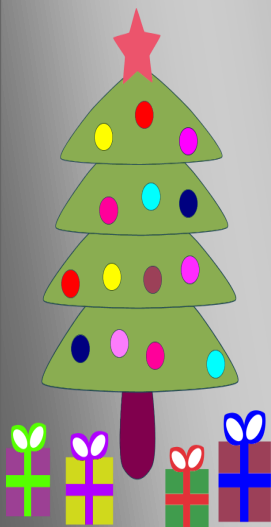

School News

Once again we approach the end of another busy Autumn Term. The Christmas Holidays are just round the corner and we have packed so much excitement and learning into the time since we returned to school in September. The whole school is getting used to the new National Curriculum with new levels for assessment and a different way of measuring children's progress.

Parents were offered the chance to attend a workshop on 'Assessment Developments' at the end of November to help them understand the new system.

The value for this half-term is Trust. The children have explored the following bible passage:

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me.' John 14:1.

The school has held three very successful open events for parents who are interested in applying for a place for their children in September 2016. All sessions were very well attended and we are looking forward to a healthy number of applicants. Years 1 and 2 have visited Warwick Castle and years 5 and 6 were given the opportunity to watch the thought provoking documentary 'He named me Malala' about the Nobel Peace Prize winner Malala Yousafzai.

A cake sale on the Junior Site raised an amazing £230 for refugees, and the money raised was donated to 'Save the Children'. A mufti day for Children in Need was well supported as ever, with everyone paying a pound for the chance to come to school dressed in clothes of their own choosing and the infants brought teddy bears to join the fun. The infant School Council also organised a cake sale and the children raised an amazing £265.65. There are numerous events taking place in the run up to Christmas, including the Infant Nativity in Cuddington on 9th and 10th December and the Junior Carol Service at Dinton Church on 15th December.

All residents are very welcome to join us at the Carol Service which begins at 7pm. After a well-earned rest over the Christmas holiday, the Year 6 children on the junior site are looking forward to First Aid training in January. This is an important and useful addition to their education even though it doesn't form part of the compulsory national curriculum.

VALE OF AYLESBURY LOCAL PLAN

Aylesbury Vale District Council have been consulting on options and issues for housing in the Vale up to 2033. The document, which can be accessed via Aylesbury Vale District Council website, has potentially major implications for Dinton, Ford and Upton as sites are offered for development with up to 20 homes per village. While the consultation ended at the end of the first week in December, it is still important to make your views known to your District Councillors. The Parish Council will keep parishioners up to date with the progress of the plan and the implications for our Parish.

WIND TURBINE APPEAL

On 15th October 2015, the Secretary of State for the Department of Communities and Local Government informed us that the Appeal against refusal of the wind turbine at Ford had been turned down. This is obviously good news as the reason given was that, in line with recent Government policy, the local community were opposed to the turbine. The appellant had 6 weeks from 15th October in which to go to the High Court if he wished to challenge the decision. The Parish Council will keep residents informed of any further news on this matter.

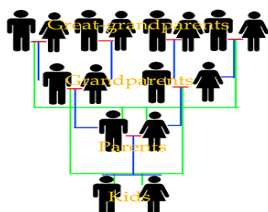

We need to raise another £5,000 to fund these items. Please help us by joining PPG 200 Club 2016 or renewing your existing membership for 2016

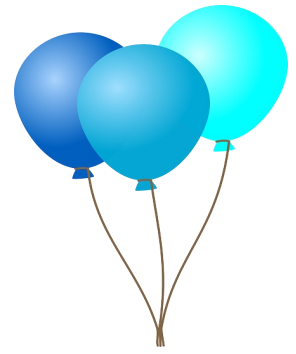
DINTON PARISH FETE

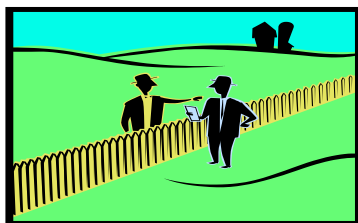
