The Parish Council welcome back the Dinton Hermit Pub after having closed in 2013. It is now all new and will operate again as a local business in Ford village.

The new pub and restaurant is owned and managed by Paul Mitchell, managing director and founder of Moogies Ltd. Other pubs owned by this business are The Black Boy in Oving, The Eight Bells in Long Crendon and the Russell Arms in Butlers Cross.

The bar and restaurant areas have a new vaulted ceiling as well as additional seating and every care has been taken to maintain the original features of the building. The new pub opened on 30th November 2019.

There are plans for a large garden to be able to eat and drink outside and in 2020 they will be refurbishing the accommodation with a total of 11 bedrooms offering bed and breakfast.

Donate a Gate

The parish council has made a grant of £385 to the North Bucks rRIPPLE (ramblers Repairing and Improving Public Paths for Leisure and Exercise). Bucks County Council prefer to see stiles replaced with gates or kissing gates. We have donated the money so that galvanised steel gates can replace two stiles in the parish. The Donate a Gate scheme has already paid £12,000 to Bucks County Council to purchase gates and a further £1,800 to Centrewire (who make the gates) for a delivery of gates.

The North Bucks rRIPPLE have already installed close to 200 gates with the 50th and 100th both being DaGs from Aylesbury Ramblers.

NEW DOG BIN—Water Lane, Ford

We have had problems with people not picking up after their dogs as well as those not disposing of the dog bags in the correct way. Whilst it is legal to put dog bags in public litter bins it's not acceptable to dispose of your dog bag in people's personal green waste bins. The purchase, installation and emptying of dog bins comes from the parish council precept (the council tax portion raised by the parish council to administer the parish and pay for certain services).

A new dog bin, with installation, costs around £350 per bin. The annual emptying charge depends on the frequency of the emptying and for our bins last year it was approx. £444.00 for the bins across the parish.

Mrs Huxley has been on such a journey with the school and the whole environment is better because of her financial knowledge and support. Mrs Stevenson has also left



us after many years of service to the school. She will be greatly missed by staff and pupils (both present and former) and we wish her much happiness as she takes a well-deserved rest from education. Whilst the school was closed during the summer holidays there has been lots of activity on both sites; the tree area on the Junior site has been cleared of rubbish and now forms a natural shelter area for use by the children at playtime - thank you to Mark Reed and his team who spent a day as volunteers to undertake the task. By achieving the PSQM we have demonstrated commitment and expertise in science teaching and leadership at Cuddington and Dinton School. We are really pleased to be able to promote Messy Church here in Dinton and also when it occurs in Chearsley; please continue to look out for the next occasion and support it whenever you can. Parents Evenings continue to be a really important and successful part of our activities and communications and F4CADS would like to send a huge thank you to everyone who donated cakes and biscuits to our stall at the Cuddington firework display. There are some fantastic bakers out there and we received a great selection of cakes and bakes. Your support meant that we were able to raise £145 for the school.

We commemorated Armistice Day on Monday 11th November at 11am for the Juniors at Dinton War memorial and at 2.30pm on the Infant site at Cuddington War memorial. Children laid wreaths from our schools and said prayers to remember the soldiers in the past, and presently, who are sacrificing their lives for our freedom. Our new netball team also played their first match of the season against Haddenham Junior school.
